

CURRENT PROJECTS UPDATE

Birth Tree Project (from Linda Reeve)

The momentum of the Birth Tree project is growing – the proposal was accepted by Gillian Kay, head of Community Services with Frankston Council, and is listed for discussion with the Management Team for the 3rd of March. We have our fingers crossed that the council will approve the project as a whole with only minor details to be finalised. One exciting adjustment to the original document was to propose the annual 'unveiling ceremony' be included in the Frankston Children's Day held at Ballam Park in April. This ties in beautifully with the spirit of the project, and will generate plenty of free PR for the project and for Rotary Peninsula 2.0. Fun Run (from Heather Lancaster)

The date has been set for the Fun Run - 23rd November, 2014. We thought this date was fitting as it is the Sunday closest to International Men's Day, and all the funds raised from this Fun Run will be supporting local men's health organisations. We will be running three events - a 2km run/walk for children, a 5km run/walk, and a 10km run. We are working closely with Seaford Little Athletics Club and hope to approach Seaford North Primary School to also become a partner in this event. We hope they can run a mini fete type of event to encourage more participants. We will also run a Logo competition for the school children, with the winning entry to be the logo used on the competitor singlet tops. We hope to run a mock event on the long weekend in June so we can trial marshalling, timing, safety, etc. so stay tuned.

Youth (from Catherine Saroukos)

To kick off 2014 we will be financing wrist bands for Youth Central Hangouts in the Frankston Council area. There are eight hangouts that give young people a safe, supervised place to go for socialising as well as education. The wristbands will be distributed through schools and in particular grades 5 and 6. This will be the start of what we intend will be an ongoing partnership between Rotary and Youth Central.





Frankston Ironman BBQ (from Gill Casey)

Again we have been given the amazing opportunity to run the BBQ for this International event. It will require volunteers for weekend commencing Friday 21st March, Saturday 22nd March and at the actual Ironman event on Sunday 23rd March. We will co-hosting this event with the Rotary Club of Frankston, with both clubs supplying the labour over the three days. A roster is available for all time spots and will be on The Box and at our next meeting. We raised an incredible amount of money last year from this event so with all members help again, it should be another successful fundraiser for both clubs.

TAC breathalyser (from Trudy Poole)

We have been working on the application for the Mobile Breathometers and have the Frankston Council on board. We have been talking to the Police Inspector for the Peninsula and he is very keen and is willing to support the application as well. We are currently in the process of finalizing the application once formal letters of support come from the Council and Police. After consultation we have decided to name the project "Check your Booze on the Move". We will also apply for funding to cover the cost of the purchase of the trailer setup.
