



GET TO KNOW A CLUB MEMBER - JOHN LEWIS (Membership Director)

We asked John Lewis to tell us a couple of things that we may not know about him:

- I I've been working in Real Estate since I was 13 years old. Every day is different and I love helping people achieve their goals. I set Us up so I could operate a business based on ethics and treating clients and staff with respect.
- 2 Passionate about youth, youth depression and their future as I lost a close friend to suicide when I was 14 years old that had a life changing influence on many of our lives. Some good some absolutely terrible. I feel the scourge of depression on our society is a major concern and we really need to look at our life style and how lonely and isolated people are in heavily populated cities. We need to stop and take the time to smell the roses.



3 - Extremely passionate about the bush access to parks 4 wheel driving and camping in the wilderness with no amenities (getting back to basics) I've had many adventures over the years. Drove a 2 wheel drive car across the Simpson Desert, swam with fresh water crocodiles, travelled all through the Kimberley, Canning Stock Route, Toured all through the Nth west coast of WA, travelled along the Old Eyre Hwy last year.

Why did he join Rotary?: "Rotary has open up a pathway that has enabled me to assist the community in ways I never thought possible. From the homeless breakfast to looking after exchange students it has put myself and my family on a wonderful journey. Being able to raise funds for worthwhile causes and being in control of where those funds get directed, gives us all a sense on giving back to our community. Most importantly Rotary to me is about fellowship; the friendship groups you create, the business networks you form are life changing. Some of the people I have met from being involved in Rotary are absolute heroes of mine and never in my wildest dreams did I ever think I would meet them, let a loan being able to call them friends and be considered an equal amongst them. That to me is what Rotary is all about".
